Meeting Minutes New Mexico Herpetological Society (NMHS) August 2, 2013

President Scott Bulgrin opened the meeting attended by 21 adults and 1 toddler. Jean Burt read the May 2013 meeting minutes. Garth Graves reported a bank balance of \$1122.75.

Old Business

Scott reported that he spoke with Larry Jones of Tucson. Larry is interested in a future presentation to NMHS (Larry was recommended by Esther Nelson – our May speaker).

Recent Outreach Events Attended by NMHS Members:

May Scott mentioned that Jerry Tuttle presented at various locations as listed in the May minutes May 17 Bioblitz at the Sandia Mountain Natural History Center, Cedar Crest – Josh, Nikki and Chloe Emms and Ted Brown represented NMHS – Scott and Josh led reptile hikes and observed a few lizards June 6 and 20 Jerry Tuttle presented reptile and amphibian talks at the Junior Rangers Program at the **Rio Grande Nature Center** June 15 Wildlife West – Nancy Bush reported that she and August attended. Variety of groups provided wildlife presentations. July 9-10 Scott presented at the Southwest Partners in Amphibian and Reptile Conservation (SWPARC) meeting in Albuquerque. His presentation was on the bosque surveys at Sandia Pueblo. July 25-28 Scott and Logan Bulgrin and Dave and Jean Burt attended the American Tarantula Society (ATS) conference in Tucson and observed numerous lizards and a few snakes while participating in several field trips. Scott recommended that NMHS members visit the Bug Museum in Santa Fe (DeVargas Mall) recently opened by Wade Harrell, an active ATS member. August 2 Scott spoke at the Esther Bone Library in Rio Rancho on New Mexico turtles.

Scott, Nancy, and August attended the SWPARC meeting in Albuquerque on July 9 and 10. The conference included presentations and field trips. Scott attended a workshop presented by Frog Watch USA. Scott suggested that NMHS could host a Frog Watch chapter or the Pueblo of Sandia could host a chapter, with NMHS members conducting surveys at the Pueblo ponds. NMHS will discuss this further at
