



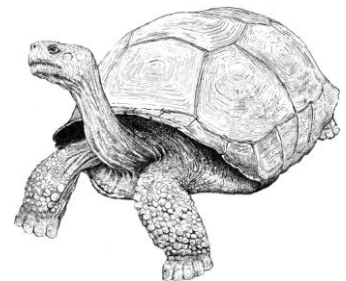

**May to September - Sandia Pueblo Herp Survey** in the Bosque on the Sandia Reservation. As we did last year, the NMHS is once again performing a survey of the herps on specified lands on the Sandia Reservation. Volunteers dug and set up about 20 pitfall traps in early May and will check these traps every Tuesday and Saturday morning. If you would like to help (it only takes a couple of hours), call Scott Bulgrin at 505-332-9672. Any help is most welcome and the Sandia Pueblo pays the NMHS for this service.

**2 November – Meeting** at 7:00PM at the American International Rattlesnake Museum in Old Town.

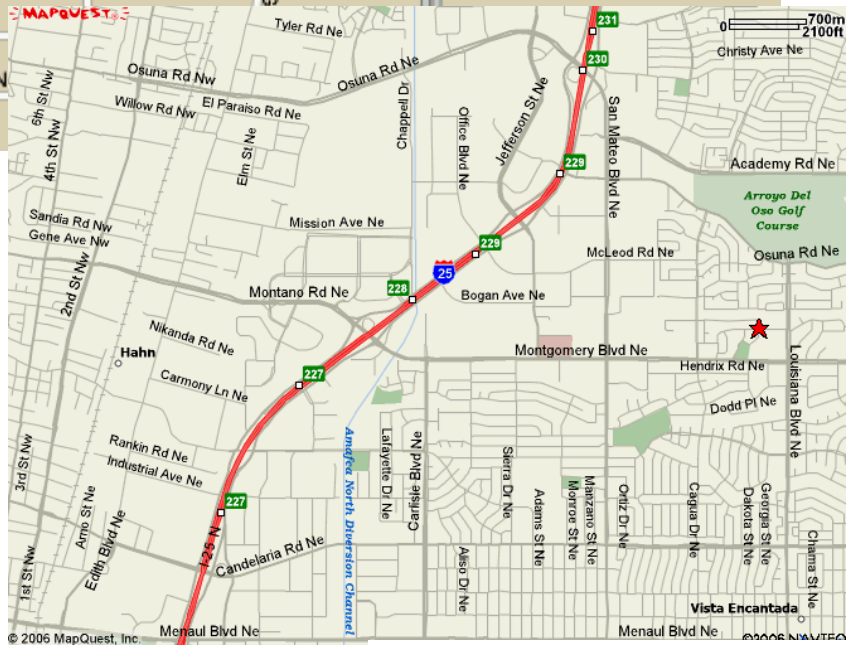
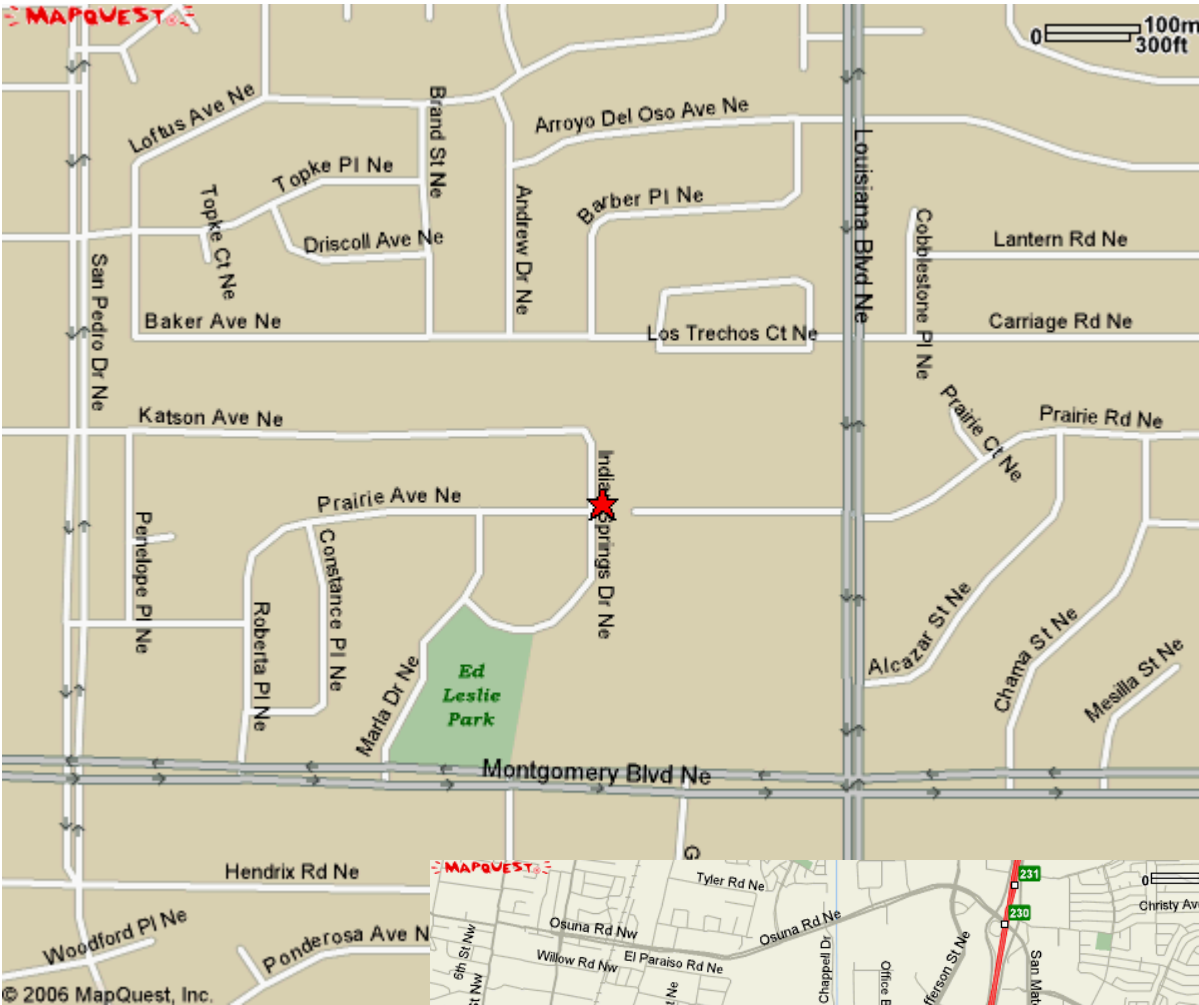


**18 – 19 November – Festival of the Cranes** at Bosque del Apache Wildlife Refuge south of Socorro, N.M. Once again we will set up with herps and the patience needed to educate the throngs that attend this annual event. Setup time is from 9:00AM to 10:00AM on Saturday the 18<sup>th</sup>. Herp setups can be left in place overnight (the room is locked). Some folks choose to spend the night in Socorro – one of the state's unsung spots for nightlife and fun (we were talking road cruising for herps, right?). The event runs from 10:00AM to 5:00PM both days. There are

generally over 5,000 visitors each day and when you get a break from answering herp questions there are lots of other booths with arts, crafts, and other animals. The raptors on display are usually worth the drive by themselves. Even if you do not choose to join us behind the display table, come on down and say hello.

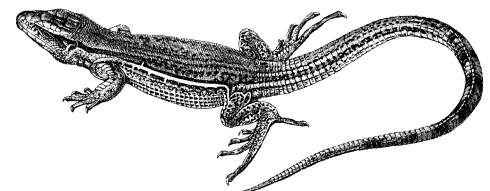

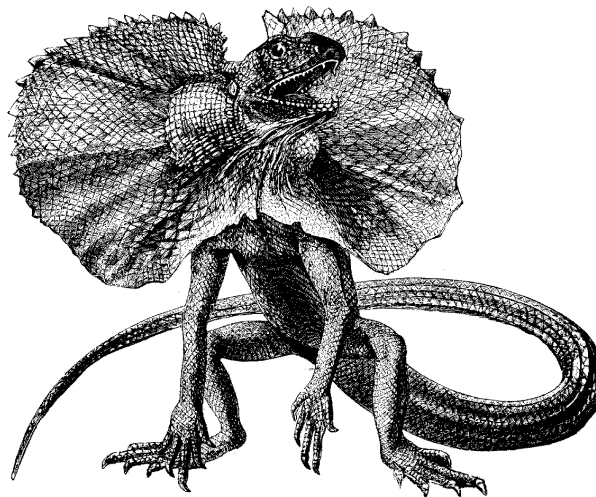
## Meeting & Activity Notes

**11-12 March – Herp Expo** at the Howard Johnson’s on Eubank. We again sponsored a raffle table along with the Rio Grande Turtle and Tortoise Club. The word really got out this time and there were easily twice as many people at this event than we normally have. A lot of the visitors were first time “just looking” types, but they will be back. We raffled off just about every prize we had and were supported very well by the various vendors. It was a great success.

**22 April - Snake Awareness Day** at the Wildlife Rescue Center in Arroyo Seco, New Mexico (just south of Española). Several NMHS volunteers showed for this event and had the chance to talk herps with center personnel as well as visitors. The rescue center is a non-profit agency that provides rescue services for native animals in coordination and with the approval of the New Mexico State Game and Fish Department. Located in what was once an open-air building for the county fair, the center now has a large climate-controlled facility with a full time staff and both indoor and outdoor facilities for rescued animals. Part of their mandate is to provide public out-reach and education, provided on this day by the NMHS.

**6 May – Earth Awareness Day in Rio Rancho and 27-29 May** - This was the second annual Earth Day Awareness held by the city of Rio Rancho. As last year, we were invited to participate and, of course, bring our herps. We set up under a tent on a couple of tables and talked herps all day to a variety of visitors. It was a pleasant day with just enough of a breeze to keep things pleasant. Exhibits included alternate energy, xeriscaping, plumbing improvements, and of course live bands and kid’s activities.

**27-29 May - Memorial Weekend Fieldtrip at The City of Rocks State Park.** The Memorial Day fieldtrip was to City of Rocks and should have been quite a trip (I was unable to attend). We will hear about it at the upcoming potluck.



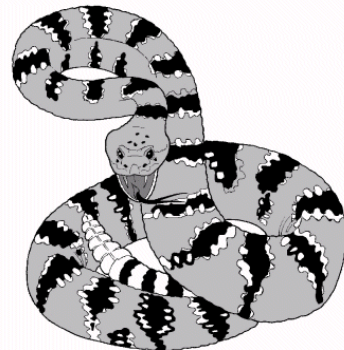
